

I/DD (Intellectual/Developmental Disability) Service Definitions

The following are definitions of services that are offered in the Arrowhead West CDDO (Community Developmental Disability Organization) area. The CDDO affiliates with Community Service Providers (CSPs) to make as many of these services as possible available. An individual may or may not be able to access a particular service depending on availability, limitations of that service, and the funding available to the individual.

Targeted Case Management

Case Management Services assist the person and their support team as they navigate the world of services and supports. Case Managers can help identify, select, obtain, and coordinate both paid services and natural supports to enhance the person's independence, integration, and productivity by using their Person Centered Support Plan as a guide.

Residential Services

Residential services are provided to individuals who live in a residential setting and do not live with someone meeting the definition of family. This service helps persons with daily living needs. It addresses the person's independence, adaptive needs, integration, and participation in the community. Requirements will vary depending on the residential home and the individual receiving the service. Room and board is not included in this service.

Day Services

Day Services are regularly occurring activities that are intended to maintain or increase adaptive capabilities, independence, or integration and participation in the community. These services are structured activities which may include employment, socialization, recreation, and community inclusion. Participation in these services helps develop a sense of personal contribution, accomplishment, or compensation.

Personal Care Services (self-directed)

Personal Care Services are available to individuals who choose to receive services in a setting that would otherwise be considered a setting requiring services to be provided by an entity licensed by KDADS. This service provides one-on-one assistance for individuals both in their home and community. PCS services means one or more personal assistants assuring the health and welfare of the individual and supporting the individual with tasks the person would typically do for themselves or by themselves if they did not have a disability.

Supportive Home Care (agency-directed)

This service provides direct assistance to recipients in daily living, attendant care, medication assistance, supervision, and household services essential to health care at home. Supportive Home Care is available to recipients who live with someone meeting the definition of family.

Respite Care

Respite Care is designed to provide relief for an individual's family member who serves as an unpaid primary caregiver. Respite is necessary for families who provide constant care for individuals so family members are able to receive periods of relief for vacations, holidays, and scheduled periods of time off. Respite care is provided in planned or emergency segments.

Enhanced Care Services (Sleep Cycle Support)

Enhanced care services are provided to individuals who live with someone meeting the definition of family. The primary purpose of enhanced care services is to give overnight assistance to recipients in case of emergencies or to assist with repositioning. The attendant must be immediately available and does not perform any other personal care, training, or homemaker tasks. A statement of medical necessity signed by a physician must be on record.

Medical Alert Rental

The purpose of this service is to provide support to a consumer who has a medical need that could become critical at anytime. The medical alert device is a small instrument carried or worn by the consumer which, by the push of a button, automatically dials the telephone of a predetermined responder who will answer the call for help. This service pays for rental, not purchase of the alert device.

Wellness Monitoring

Wellness Monitoring is a process whereby a registered nurse evaluates the level of wellness of a consumer to determine if the consumer is properly using medical health services as recommended by a physician. It is also used to determine if the health of the individual is sufficient to maintain him in his place of residence without more frequent skilled nursing intervention.

Assistive Services

Assistive Services are supports or items that meet an individual's assessed need by improving and/or promoting the person's health, independence, productivity, or integration into the community, and directly relate to the individual's Person Centered Support Plan with measurable outcomes. This could include the following:

- Home Modifications/Equipment**

- Van Lifts**

- Communication Devices**

- Wheelchair Modifications**
